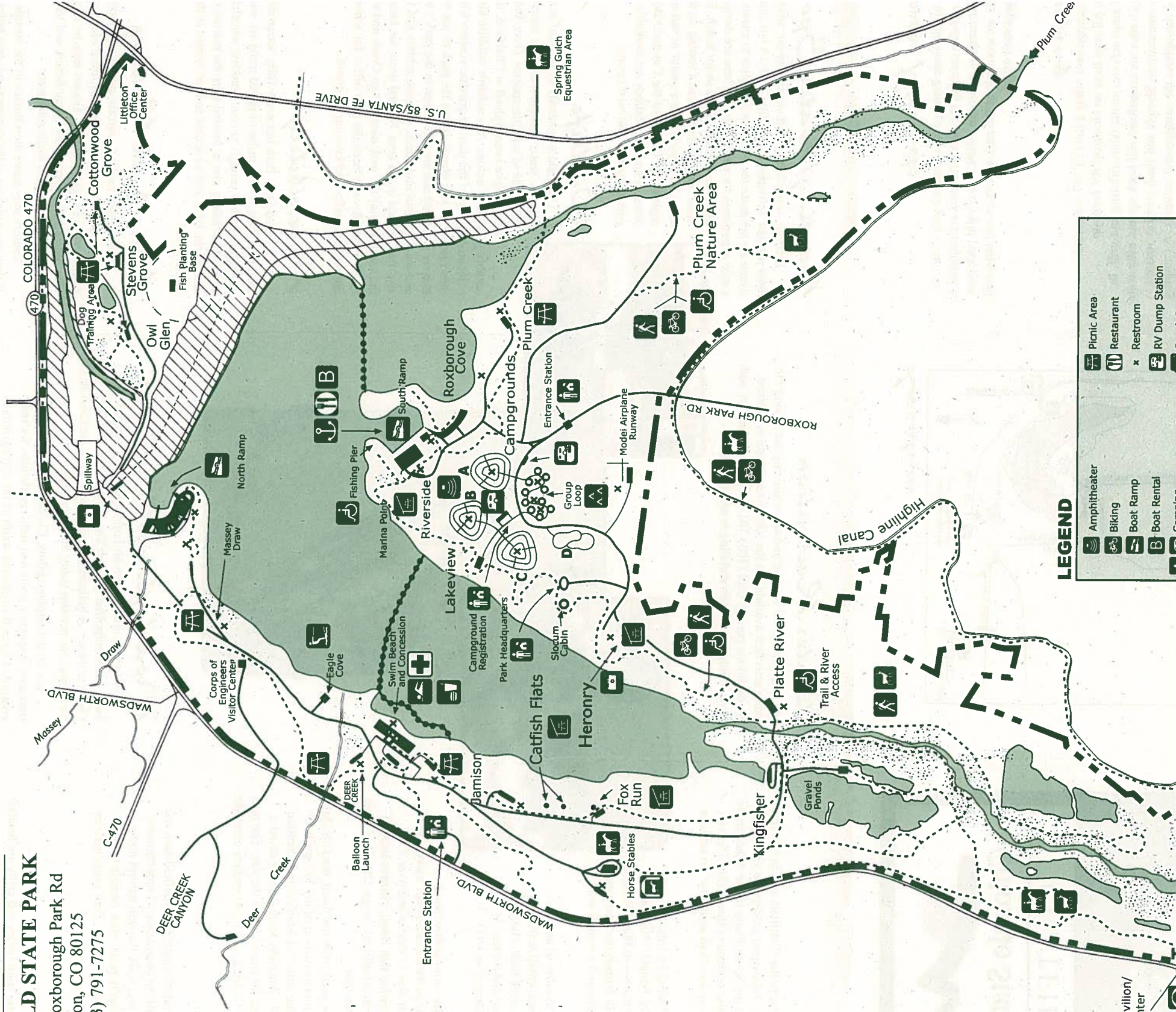

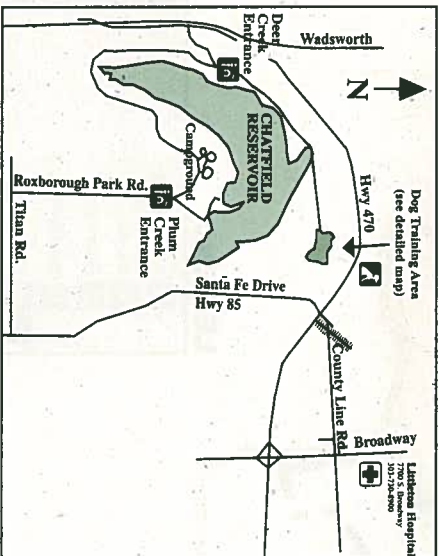

provide the public with a multitude of services such as
information, rescue, special programs and first aid.

First Aid

Park rangers are trained to give basic first aid. Littleton
Hospital is located approximately ten miles east of the
Deer Creek entrance at Broadway and Mineral Avenue.

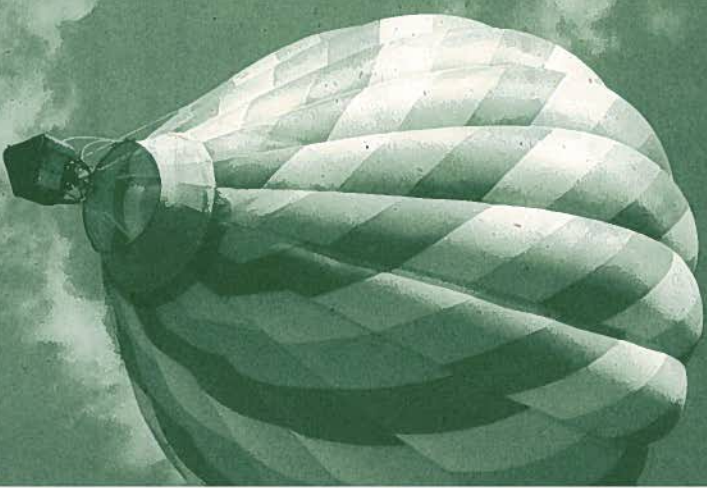
